




Background



- Alternative-Virtual-Credit Recovery School
- 100% FRL, 74% minority (borders Navajo Nation)
- 14% ELL students



- 8% homeless, 30% transient
- 2018-19 is first year for Freshman cohort
- Onsite Daycare provide by PMS
- All students have at least one EWS warning marker
- 239 students (180 day school, rest online)
