The Cross-State High School Collaborative (CSHSC) is a two-year project supported by CCSSO and led by Bob Balfanz at the Everyone Graduates Center at Johns Hopkins University. The CSHSC is dedicated to utilizing the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) to engage communities in redesigning high schools. This approach includes a future-oriented framework to design new high schools for the 21st century, rather than tweak struggling high schools that are currently viewed as failing and in need of reform. This evidence-based, locally-oriented and customizable strategy also focuses on fostering strong pathways for all students through high school to post- secondary to adult success.

At this convening of the Cross-State High School Collaborative members will focus on progress monitoring using indicators and metrics to determine the effectiveness of their redesign work. Additionally, collaborative members will learn from high schools undergoing the redesign process in New Mexico about their design approach and lessons learned from the first year of planning and implementation.
